Verbos con dos participios, uno regular y uno irregular

When the verb has two meanings, the regular participle is used more often, and the irregular participle is used according to the context of the sentence.

When the verb has only one meaning, the regular participle is used with that meaning, but the irregular participle references a special meaning.
